**ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME**

(Issued March 25, 2005)

On March 21, 2005, the Consumer Advocate Division of the Department of Justice (Consumer Advocate) filed with the Utilities Board (Board) a motion for an extension of time to respond to information filed on March 18, 2005, by USA Voicemail Service (USA Voicemail) in response to the petition for proceeding to consider civil penalty for an alleged cramming violation filed by Consumer Advocate on December 28, 2004. Consumer Advocate requests that the Board allow it approximately 30 days for the purpose of obtaining the complaining customer's response to the information provided by USA Voicemail and determining an appropriate reply. The Board finds this request reasonable and will grant the motion.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

The motion for extension of time filed by the Consumer Advocate Division of the Department of Justice on March 21, 2005, is granted. Consumer Advocate shall file a reply to USA Voicemail Service's March 18, 2005, response to the December 28, 2004, petition for proceeding to consider civil penalty on or before April 21, 2005.
