**ORDER CANCELING CERTIFICATE AND WITHDRAWING TARIFF**

(Issued April 4, 2005)

On January 31, 2003, the Utilities Board (Board) issued a certificate of public convenience and necessity, identified as Certificate No. 0263, to iLOKA, Inc., d/b/a Microtech-Tel (Microtech), authorizing Microtech to provide local telecommunications service in Iowa. Also on January 31, 2003, the Board approved Microtech's tariff, identified as TF-02-570.

Recently, Board staff learned that Microtech had changed locations and was not providing telecommunications service in Iowa. Board staff made several unsuccessful attempts to contact Microtech by telephone to request updated corporate information and to learn Microtech's plans for providing service in Iowa. On February 22, 2005, a letter was sent to Microtech at its last known address requesting contact with the Board. Microtech has not responded to any of the contact attempts. The Board concludes that Microtech is not an operational company in Iowa. Therefore, the Board will cancel Microtech's certificate and withdraw its tariff

within 30 days from the date of this order unless the Board is contacted by Microtech within that time period and provided with updated corporate information.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

iLOKA, Inc., d/b/a Microtech-Tel, must contact the Board with updated corporate information within 30 days of the date of this order. If the Board does not receive a response within 30 days, iLOKA, Inc., d/b/a Microtech-Tel's certificate of public convenience and necessity, Certificate No. 0263, shall be deemed canceled and iLOKA, Inc., d/b/a Microtech-Tel's tariff, identified as TF-02-570, shall be deemed withdrawn without further action by the Board.
