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**ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION OF TIME**

(Issued February 10, 2006)

On February 6, 2006, Telseven, L.L.C. (Telseven), filed with the Utilities Board (Board) a motion for extension of time to file a response to the petition filed in this docket by the Consumer Advocate Division of the Department of Justice (Consumer Advocate) on January 17, 2006. Telseven asks that it be granted an extension of time to March 1, 2006, in which to respond.

Telseven indicates that it is working to develop a procedure for responding to any complaints which may be brought before the Board and that part of that procedure will involve gathering its call records and records from the interexchange and local exchange carriers involved in carrying and originating any disputed calls.

Telseven indicates it should have the procedure to obtain this information in place by the end of February 2006.

The Board finds Telseven's request reasonable and will grant the motion for extension of time to March 1, 2006.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

The motion for extension of time filed by Telseven, L.L.C., in this docket on February 6, 2006, is granted. Telseven, L.L.C., must file a response to Consumer Advocate's petition for proceeding to consider civil penalty on or before March 1, 2006.
