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**ORDER GRANTING ONE-MONTH EXTENSION OF WAIVER**

(Issued May 30, 2006)

On February 28, 2006, Interstate Power and Light Company (IPL) filed with the Utilities Board (Board) a request for a two-year extension of a waiver of the electric energy adjustment clause (EAC) rules related to flowing costs and credits associated with participation in wholesale markets operated by regional transmission organizations through the EAC for recovery. The Board originally granted a waiver allowing these costs and credits to flow through IPL's EAC on May 13, 2004, in Docket No. WRU-04-14-150; the current waiver expires on May 31, 2006.

The Consumer Advocate Division of the Department of Justice and the Large Energy Group each filed substantive responses to the waiver. The primary issues raised by the responses involve the length of the waiver period and whether any conditions should be imposed.

The Board is reviewing the waiver request and responses. Because this review will not be completed by May 31, 2006, when the initial two-year waiver expires, the Board will extend the waiver for one month, through June 30, 2006. This

will allow the Board adequate time to thoroughly review the arguments presented by the parties and issue a final ruling on IPL's extension request.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

The waiver of the relevant EAC rules granted to Interstate Power and Light Company on May 13, 2004, in Docket No. WRU-04-14-150, for a two-year period ending May 31, 2006, is extended through June 30, 2006.
