IN RE: MIDAMERICAN ENERGY COMPANY	DOCKET NO. TF-06-196
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ORDER APPROVING TARIFF

(Issued June 30, 2006)

On June 29, 2006, MidAmerican Energy Company (MidAmerican) filed with the Utilities Board (Board) revised tariff sheets, identified as TF-06-196, for Rider No. 13, Interruptible Load Replacement Energy Service. The proposed revisions add the option of supplying load through Mid-Continent Area Power Pool (MAPP)-approved utility self-generation. MidAmerican states that MAPP is allowing this option on a temporary basis for the summer of 2006, after which MAPP will evaluate whether the option should be continued. MidAmerican requested expedited review of the proposed revisions so it would be available for use during what is often the greatest period of curtailment, July and August.

Currently, one customer takes service under Rider 13 and MidAmerican states the customer has requested that MidAmerican consider interruptible supply alternatives that may result in the ability to buy through during curtailments should the customer's market conditions require continued production. Prior to MAPP allowing the utility self-generation option, the customer was not able to obtain energy from the reserve sharing pool at MAPP. Accompanying the proposed tariff revisions was a

letter from MidAmerican indicating that the customer agrees to the proposed rider changes and that the Consumer Advocate Division of the Department of Justice has no objection to the proposed revisions.

The Board will approve the revisions. The tariff is currently limited to one customer and is set to expire on April 30, 2007. The revisions will allow the customer to have an additional buy-through option this summer; at the end of the summer, MAPP and MidAmerican will each determine whether the option should continue or be extended to additional customers. The tariff's terms indicate it is not available to new customers after April 30, 2002. If MidAmerican decides it wants to extend the option in some form, the Board, and any interested parties, will have an opportunity to revisit the rider.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

Tariff filing TF-06-196 is approved, effective as of the date of this order, subject to complaint or investigation.
