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**REVISED PROCEDURAL ORDER AND NOTICE OF HEARING**

(Issued October 17, 2006)

On October 4, 2006, the undersigned administrative law judge issued a procedural order and notice of hearing setting the procedural schedule for the case. On October 12, 2006, the Consumer Advocate Division of the Department of Justice (Consumer Advocate) filed a request to modify the procedural schedule. The Consumer Advocate requested a period of 21 days between Evercom's testimony and its rebuttal testimony. The Consumer Advocate stated Evercom had no objection to the request. The Consumer Advocate further stated that Evercom requested a period of three weeks to file its prepared testimony. The Consumer Advocate does not object to Evercom's request.

The parties are in agreement regarding the requested modifications, the length of time requested is short, and it is the parties' first request to modify the procedural

schedule. Therefore, the requests appear reasonable and should be granted. The procedural schedule and hearing date are modified as set forth below.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

1. On or before February 5, 2007, Evercom must file prepared testimony and exhibits and a prehearing brief.

2. If any party wishes to have a witness connected to the hearing by telephone conference call, the party must file written notification with the Board no later than February 15, 2007.

3. If the Consumer Advocate or any intervenor is going to file prepared rebuttal testimony and exhibits or a rebuttal brief, it must do so on or before February 26, 2007.

4. A hearing for the presentation of evidence and the cross-examination of witnesses will be held in the Board Hearing Room, 350 Maple Street, Des Moines, Iowa, on Tuesday, March 13, 2007, commencing at 9 a.m. Each party must provide a copy of its prepared testimony and exhibits to the court reporter. Persons with disabilities requiring assistive services or devices to observe or participate should contact the Board at 1-515-281-5256 no later than five business days prior to the hearing to request that appropriate arrangements be made.

5. All portions of the "Procedural Order and Notice of Hearing" issued October 4, 2006, not specifically modified by this order remain in effect.
