ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

(Issued July 14, 2008)

On May 29, 2008, MCImetro Access Transmission Services LLC, d/b/a Verizon Access Transmission Services, and MCI Communications Services, Inc., d/b/a Verizon Business Services (collectively "Verizon"), filed with the Utilities Board (Board) a complaint pursuant to Iowa Code §§ 476.1, 476.2, 476.3, 476.5; 476.11, 476.29, and 476.101(1), and 199 IAC chapters 6 and 7 alleging violations of the terms, conditions, and application of the intrastate tariffs of BTC Inc., d/b/a Western

Iowa Networks (Western Iowa), OmniTel Communications, Inc. (OmniTel), and Premier Communications, Inc. (Premier) (collectively "Respondents").

In support of its complaint, Verizon claims that the Respondents are engaging in a fraudulent practice by creating a scheme that involves free conference calls, chat rooms, adult content calling, podcasts, voicemail, and international calling services. Verizon asserts that the Respondents are charging Verizon and other interexchange carriers excessive rates for the routing and termination of calls to companies that advertise these free services and then providing kickbacks of a portion of the terminating access revenues to these free calling service companies.

On June 20, 2008, the Board issued an order granting a motion for an extension of time to file a response to Verizon's complaint, which was filed by the Respondents on June 16, 2008. Pursuant to the June 20 order, the Respondents were permitted to file a response to Verizon's complaint on or before July 9, 2008.

On July 8, 2008, Verizon and the Respondents filed a joint motion for an extension of time. In support of their motion, the parties ask for an extension until July 23, 2008, so that the parties can explore settlement possibilities.

The Board has reviewed the parties' request and finds that it is reasonable. The joint motion for extension of time will be granted and the Respondents will be allowed to file a response to Verizon's complaint on or before July 23, 2008.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

The joint motion for extension of time filed by BTC Inc., d/b/a Western Iowa Networks, OmniTel Communications, Inc., Premier Communications, Inc., and MCImetro Access Transmission Services LLC, d/b/a Verizon Access Transmission Services, and MCI Communications Services, Inc., d/b/a Verizon Business Services, on July 8, 2008, is granted as described in this order.
