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**ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION OF TIME**

(Issued October 30, 2008)

Subrule 199 IAC 20.9(4) provides that each year the Utilities Board (Board) will select two months of the previous calendar year and require each rate-regulated electric utility that owns generation and utilizes an energy adjustment clause to file fuel, freight, and transportation invoices for those months. On March 5, 2008, the Board issued an order directing Interstate Power and Light Company (IPL) to file its fuel, freight, and transportation invoices for the months of September and October 2007, on or before November 1, 2008.

On October 28, 2008, IPL filed a request for extension of time until December 1, 2008, to file the required invoices. In support of its request, IPL said the 2008 flood caused its accounting staff to fall behind on several projects. Also, IPL said it purchased the COMTRAC fuel management system in 2007 and that implementation of this system has resulted in increased efforts by IPL's staff to extract and reconcile the supporting invoices for September and October 2007. Counsel for the Board contacted counsel for the Consumer Advocate Division of the

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Department of Justice (Consumer Advocate). Consumer Advocate has no objection to the extension.

The Board will grant the extension. The filing will now be due on or before December 1, 2008.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:**

Interstate Power and Light Company shall file on or before December 1, 2008, all fuel, freight, and transportation invoices for the months of September and October 2007.
